## COVID-19

- Asymptomatic testing is no longer required in any educational setting
- Staff with a positive COVID-19 test result are advised to try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for five days, which is when they are most infectious.
- Pupils and young people under 18 with a positive test are advised to try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for three days.
- Schools should ensure all eligible groups are enabled and supported to take the offer of national vaccination programmes including COVID 19 and flu.
- Schools/ Cluster should continue to ensure occupied spaces are well-ventilated.
- Schools/ Cluster should continue to reinforce good hygiene practices such as hand washing and cleaning.

For any pregnant staff or pupils, we do still require that a covid risk assessment is undertaken given the ongoing risk identified by the Royal College of Midwives.
